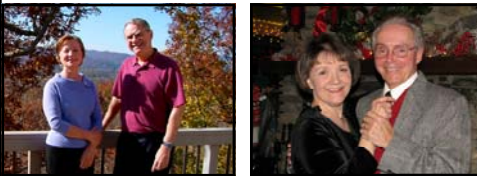

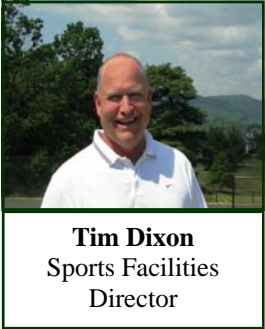

## A Good Foundation for Fitness

The importance of good athletic shoes cannot be overstated. Old or poor fitting shoes can cause foot, ankle, knee and hip problems. Also, shoes that are appropriate for one activity may be inappropriate for another. Here are some things to consider when evaluating or replacing your athletic shoes.

- Buy shoes where knowledgeable staff can help you choose the appropriate shoe for your foot and activity.
- Don't wait until the bottom of your shoes wear out before you replace them. Insoles often wear out before the soles and uppers of the shoe.
- Walking shoes have good cushion and stability but are not appropriate for tennis or aerobics classes.
- Tennis shoes have lateral stability and long-lasting soles but are not ideal for walking .
- Running shoes have more cushioning in the fore-foot and heel but have little lateral stability which makes them a poor choice for tennis or aerobics classes.
- Light hikers have good cushioning and support with the addition of a more aggressive tread for better traction.
- Cross-Trainers are designed for a variety of activities but should not be seen as a "do everything" shoe.
