PICKLEBALL NEWS

Our mild winter has allowed us to enjoy many Pickleball games. With many new players joining the community, the warm and sunny days have seen some busy courts. As we look forward to spring, many events are planned. Kudos to Sandro Francioni who won gold at the NC Senior Games, State Finals late last year. Sandro and his partner first qualified by winning gold at the county level. This was followed by the state finals in Cary, NC where players from around the state participated based on age and skill level.

The courts and equipment always need attention. A maintenance day is scheduled for Saturday, April 1st. Windscreens will get repaired, ground wires fixed, nets cleaned, and chairs and



umbrellas moved. These are a few of the tasks, but with the usual large number of volunteers, those tasks should be completed quickly. Also look for some new chairs and umbrellas this year. To cover the various needs of the Pickleball community, we will again solicit an annual voluntary fee of \$10 per member. In addition, the committee is looking for donations of used towels, to aid in the drying of the courts. We are always looking for unwanted used paddles that would be used by new players or visiting families. The always successful annual Introduction to Pickleball is scheduled for Saturday April 8th. The times for this event and any rain dates will be communicated soon. FROM THE CUMMINGS COVE DESIGN REVIEW BOARD

Cummings Cove is a planned mountain community made up of the golf course, roads, common use areas and structures, and home sites integrated with the natural landscape and with each other to create a harmonious environment for residents. The Cummings Cove Design Review Board (DRB) is established in accordance with the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions, and comprises resident volunteers charged with helping to protect the design objectives for the community. The Cummings Cove Design Guidelines, which are available on the Owners' website, form the primary basis for DRB decisions relating to any changes residents wish to make to the exterior appearance or footprint of their home, addition or removal of landscape features such as trees, and maintenance of the appearance of all properties.

Residents of Cummings Cove desiring to perform or contract for exterior work, other than routine maintenance, on their home or lot should first contact the DRB and receive approval to proceed. This is a very important step as residents may have to remediate any unapproved work found to be in violation of the Design Guidelines. If you are planning any exterior work on your property and you're unsure whether or not DRB approval is needed, contact us and we'll work with you. Please be assured that our intent is not to dictate to you what you may and may not do with your property. We simply want to ensure the attractive, natural appearance of the community is preserved.

Cummings Cove Real Estate News

The past 6 months have seen dramatic changes in the real estate marketplace. However, Cummings Cove remains uniquely its own both in a local and national sense, continuing to have much less available inventory than it has interested buyers.

Nationally the supply of for sale homes rose at a record annual pace for the sixth month in a row, up 67.8% year over year in February, signaling the housing market's continued rebalancing, according to the Realtor.com Monthly Housing Trends Report. Despite the significant national increase in inventory over last year's record lows, home prices are still growing, albeit at a slower pace of 7.8% over last February. The substantial increases in home prices have not escaped Cummings Cove. For sellers that is a big plus, but if you are not selling the new tax assessments have been a bit shocking.

Even with low inventory the Cummings Cove market does not particularly favor buyers or sellers under the current conditions. Both sides will likely have to make reasonable efforts to make a deal happen. As mortgage rates continue to fluctuate and home buying costs increase, it's essential for sellers to market price their homes appropriately to attract willing buyers in what has become a cautious market. Cummings Cove buyers are historically not so influenced by interest rates. However, buyers are now facing market uncertainties on several fronts at a time when prices are still historically high. Buyers are clearly becoming much more vigilant to avoid overpaying. Overpriced homes in the now less frenzied post-Covid market are taking much longer to sell and can even end up not selling or selling for less than if they were properly market priced in the first place. An overpriced home in Cummings Cove can certainly sit on the market longer than it should adding aggravation and risk.
