EVENTS COMMITTEE NEWS





Have you been to the Victory Garden recently? Remember to stop by the Pollinator Garden. It's beautiful and the birds and butterflies know it. Soon you will too! Oh my gosh, you can watch the plants growing right in front of you!! The garden is one of those places you can go to and watch the clouds sail across the sky. Problems can be solved; dreams can be created. You can rest your weary feet or your mind as you stop by and appreciate the beauty of the Victory Garden and all it beholds.

As of the beginning of June, over 1,000 pounds of fresh, nutritious vegetables have been harvested and delivered to the Fishes & Loaves food pantry in Etowah

and The Sharing House in Brevard. A lot of people benefit by receiving the kale, cabbage, lettuce, radishes, etc. The summer (warm temperature) plants and seeds are being put into the ground now. There's a lot more to come!

I've been thinking about the importance of good nutrition lately. Our veggies are harvested several times a week, and they're distributed to the food pantries as soon as possible. That means the clients get the best vitamins, minerals, fiber and taste the plants offer. Our neighbors are receiving the best food for brain health, body health, and they know these veggies are being grown just because we care, even if we don't know them. That translates to them feeling worthy, cared for and recognized by others they don't necessarily know. Neighbors matter!
