

REAL ESTATE NEWS

Real estate across the country continues to be a regional market story. Markets attracting buyers remain inventory starved for buyer desired offerings. As of the end of July, in Cummings Cove, the total buyer traffic count was 180 visitors, which is 40 less than last year at the same time. Of those visiting, very few buyers are finding resale homes that fit their price points with desired size and/or features. However, if a home is priced and marketed properly it will still, in most cases, eventually find a buyer. As the overall buyer pool slowly continues to decrease, the remaining buyers are becoming far less likely to settle for anything that does not fully fit their overall criteria of wants and needs.
